EMERGENCY EDUCATIONAL GRANTS

Undergraduate financial assistance for children of deceased or totally disabled Elks in the form of renewable, one-year grants of up to **\$5,000**. This grant is for educational assistance only and is not intended to cover the entire cost of a college education.

ELIGIBILITY

- Attend an accredited U.S. college or university as a full-time (12 semester hours) undergraduate student.
- Demonstrate financial need.
- Be unmarried and under the age of 24 during the academic year for which assistance is desired.

APPLICATIONS

Available by request between **May 1** and **December 31** of the academic year for which assistance is desired.


