

The Sanford Elks Lodge #1679 has been in existence for 78 years. The organization started as a "men's only" lodge until 2011 when they joined the national organization and welcomed women as members.

On April 10, the Sanford lodge installed their first woman president (Exalted Ruler) to lead the Lodge this year. Chanda Coomer, who has served in various officer positions for the last four years received the gavel in the annual installation of officers opening a new year of members benefits as well as extensive charitable services to the community.

Using grants from the Elks National Foundation as well as local fundraisers, the Sanford Elks sponsor the student of the year program, hoop shoot competition, a food drive and financial support for Back-Pack-Pals program and various Veterans benefit projects.

In 2023 the Sanford Elks will continue their signature programs proclaiming Teens Are Kid Too by providing Christmas toys for teens and Cleats For Kids a program providing cleats for student athletes.

In addition to youth and veterans' programs, the Elks support patriotism projects such as an annual essay contest as well as drug awareness programs. In addition, they offer various college scholarships.
