In the spirit of transparency, I want to provide an update on the pool. It may seem that progress has stalled, but that's not the case. We are currently waiting for inspections from the city before we can proceed to the next phase. We recently conducted a pressure test to ensure the pool piping system was intact. During this test, we discovered a leak. While repairing it, we realized that due to the pool's age, it would be challenging to bring it up to current standards as it is constructed. Therefore, we have developed a plan to meet code requirements and update our piping system for future repairs. Closing the pool this season was a difficult decision, but it was made with the safety of our members and their families in mind. Our pool is over 60 years old, and we've only done minimal maintenance to keep it open over the years. It was time for a major repair, and we didn't want to rush it. With older construction, you can only choose two out of three: cheap, fast, and right. We opted for right and affordable. We are planning to host a summer bash event for our members and their families.

In other news, our Food Drive is in full swing for our local CUOC, and we are planning a service day to help them pack up The Backpack Pals Program and assist with their warehouse.

On Flag Day, I personally visited eight local businesses and presented them with an honorary certificate for flying our nation's flag.

I hope everyone noticed the flag displayed in front of the lodge, showcasing the history of our great nation's flag. I hope everyone has a happy and safe July 4th. We will continue to keep everyone updated on the pool's progress and our events through our weekly blast and Facebook. If you have any concerns or questions, please feel free to reach out to me.

Pool Update

After discovering a leak in one of the pool returns, it was determined that due to the age and condition of the piping, all the piping for the skimmers and returns needs to be replaced. This will involve digging a trench that is 3 feet wide and 3 feet deep around the entire pool, installing new piping, and setting up new returns. We are currently in the process of meeting with county inspectors to review our plans and obtain their input and approval. Once we have received approval, we will proceed with the construction.




